### 6.B. Ratify Initial Joint Proposal between California Federation of Teachers and Sonora Union High School District (Sunshine Document) for 2017/18 Interest-based Negotiations

Pursuant to Government Code Section 3547.5, initial proposals by the exclusive representatives for the California Federation of Teachers, Local 3187, and the

District are required to be presented in open session of a Board meeting prior to the opening of formal interest-based bargaining sessions. In accordance with the contract, the entire agreement shall be reopened during the 2017-2018 negotiations.

## 6.C. Approve Resolution 2017/18-18 Surplus Personal Property Under \$2,500 - Toshiba Copy Machine from Alternative Education Campus

The District has concluded that the copy machine at the Alternative Education campus needs to be disposed of for the purpose of replacement, and requests authorization from the Board to appoint an employee to sell or dispose of the property as set forth in the resolution.

### 6.D. Approve Contract with Ray Morgan Company for Copy Machine Lease

The District needs to replace the broken copy machine located at the Alternative Education campus. The District leases all other copy machines from Ray Morgan and recommends using the same company for the replacement machine.

## 6.E. Approve Grazing Lease Agreement with Jacob Gookin

The lease agreement with Jacob Gookin will allow cattle grazing on the Wildcat Ranch.

## 6.F. Approve Overnight Field Trip Request by Sonora High French Club

The Sonora High French Club is requesting permission to travel to France from June 18-27, 2018, to experience Paris, Normandy and the Loir Valley. Teacher Carol Woods and participating students will pay for any trip expenses.

## 6.G. Approve Overnight Field Trip Request by AFS Club

Students belonging to the AFS Club, an international youth exchange organization, are requesting permission to attend a trip to Park Ridge, New Jersey from March 21-26, 2018. Trip expenses will be paid for by fundraising and students participating in the trip.

## 6.H. Approve MOU, Contract Addendum, with California Federation of Teachers (CFT)

The District and the California Federation of Teachers have negotiated terms relating to CLAD requirements. The agreement states that the District will pay for emergency permits, and will allow teachers time off from work to obtain EL authorization. The agreement also defines new deadlines for teachers to obtain their EL authorization.

# 6.I. Approve 2018-2019 Service Agreements with Tuolumne County Superintendent of Schools (TCSOS)

## 6.N. First Reading with Consideration to Waive Additional Readings and Approve BP and AR 4112.22 Staff Teaching English Learners

The District revised the BP and AR to reflect terms agreed to in the MOU Addendum to the California Federation of Teachers' contract. Policy and regulation revised to reflect new deadlines for teachers to obtain their EL authorization, and to include the SDAIE (Specifically Designed Academic Instruction in English). The SDAIE is the appropriate authorization issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing for CTE teachers.
