Job Description

POSITION TITLE: Medical Careers Instructor ROP

SALARY PLACEMENT: Certificated Salary Schedule

Definition: Responsible for the development, implementation, management and teaching of a curriculum which will qualify persons for employment in a health care setting. The instructor will also provide all classroom/laboratory instruction. The instructor will be responsible for training site acquisition, student placement, and supervision.

Duties and Responsibilities: (Any one position may not include all of the listed duties, nor do all of the listed examples include all tasks which may be found in positions within this classification.)

- Annually prepares and submits a course of study including program objectives, student performance objectives and daily lesson plans
- Provides related instruction and supervises student training in community health agencies, medical offices and/or acute care hospitals
- Annually prepares and submits a program budget and is responsible for making requests for
 materials and supplies not to exceed the amount and type of expenditures set forth in the
 approved budget
- Annually submits a report of the total number of hours at the completion or termination of a student's training, training the student received and the related skills achieved
- Assists in student placement activities
- Accurately and punctually submits to the director all forms and information needed for attendance accounting and grade reporting
- Establishes an advisory committee to include representatives from community health care providers and agencies including, but not limited to, acute care hospitals
- Holds a minimum of one meeting of this committee during each school year
- Attends staff meetings and other meetings as shall be required by director
- Performs other duties related to this position
- Observes and abides by the administrative policies for credentialed personnel set forth by the California Department of Education

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education, Training, and Experience

 Possess or qualify for a California Designated Subject Vocational Teaching Credential authorizing instruction in Medical Office Services, Health Care Information Services, Health Care Diagnostic Services, or Nursing Services

- To qualify for a vocational credential, the minimum requirement is verification by previous employers of five years of full-time, paid or non-paid, work experience directly related to each subject to be named on the credential.
- Forty-eight semester units or post-secondary vocational training related to the subject named on the credential and verified by official transcript may be substituted for a maximum of two of the five years of experience.
- One year of the required work experience shall be within the three years immediately preceding the issuance of the credential.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- Knowledge of health care organizations, hospital policies and procedures
- Provide instruction in the theory and practice of health occupations skills consistent with occupational practices and procedures including practical ethics and confidentiality; basic medical records, charts, and forms; medical terminology
- Knowledge of instructional methods and techniques which are used in assisting persons to gain the skills needed for entry level positions in health service occupations
- Knowledge of courses of instructional materials appropriate to such training
- Specific skills, knowledge, and attitudes needed for achieving employment as a health care worker. Assist in student placement
- Knowledge of employment trends in health service occupations
- Ability to follow instructions and work independently without constant supervision; skill to develop program goals and student performance objectives
- Analyze and evaluate abilities and aptitudes and prescribe instructional techniques and methods to assist persons in reading outlined performance objectives
- Interpersonal skills to gain the interest, respect, and cooperation of students
- Problem solving skills to analyze instructional situations accurately and adopt an effective course of action to obtain maximum learning
- Ability to implement behavior modification techniques into practical situations
- Ability to communicate effectively
- Skill to effectively use and operate audio-visual and other equipment normally used for instructing this occupation
- Develop and maintain an advisory committee for this program.

Other Characteristics: Possess a valid California driver's license and/or be able to provide own transportation in conduct of work assignments. Willingness to travel locally.

Health Careers Preparation: This course is designed to provide students with the skills required for successful completion of health-related classes. It includes the fundamentals of medical terminology and a review of basic body systems with anatomical and physiology terms defined. Emphasis on spelling, work pronunciation, medical abbreviations and definition of terms provides students with a foundation medical vocabulary. The course also includes a review of basic arithmetic skills and an overview of math skills required in the health-related career fields. Integrated throughout the course are career preparation standards including academic skills, communication, interpersonal skills, problem solving, safety, technology and an overview of healthcare industry. This course is a prerequisite for other healthcare courses.

Physical Requirements: Employees in the position must have the ability to:

- 1. Stand for extended periods of time.
- 2. Enter data into a computer terminal/typewriter, operate standard office equipment, and use a telephone.
- 3. See and read a computer screen and printed matter with or without vision aids.
- 4. Hear and understand speech at normal levels and on the telephone.
- 5. Speak so that others may understand at normal levels and on the telephone.
- 6. Stand, walk, and bend over, reach overhead, grasp, push, pull and move, lift and/or carry up to 25 pounds to waist height.
- 7. Operate a vehicle in the course of carrying out assigned duties.
- 8. Have experience in catering for large groups and be able to work extended hours beyond the regular school day when needed.

Work Environment: Employees in this position will be required to work indoors in a standard classroom environment and come in direct contact with school staff, district staff and the public. Working in a hospital or health clinic may involves exposure to chemicals, medications, traumatic events and seriously ill or deceased persons. There is moderate physical activity required. A Medical Careers teacher should be able to lift 25 pounds and be fit enough to stand and/or walk for most of the work day.
